The Department of Counseling and Human Development Services in the College of Education at The University of Georgia seeks highly qualified candidates to fill a full-time, tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor. The primary assignment for this position is with the Counseling and Student Personnel Services doctoral program at the UGA campus at Gwinnett and will begin in 2010. This doctoral program is a part-time, cohort model program designed to meet CACREP standards to prepare graduates to be counselor educators and/or to assume leadership positions in pK-16 educational settings. The primary areas of specialization beyond the counseling core are school counseling and student affairs administration. The intent of the program is to provide a vehicle for advanced graduate study to individuals holding master's degrees in counseling or college student development that have at least three years of post-master's experience and are currently employed at least one-half time in a pK-12 school or in a college or university setting. The areas of focus for the degree are pK-16 educational counseling and social justice. Salary is competitive and includes an excellent fringe benefit package.

The Department of Counseling and Human Development Services prepares professionals for a changing and increasingly complex world. The department, ranked by *U.S. News and World Report* as one of the nation's top 10 graduate programs in its field, offers one of the largest graduate programs at UGA.
