- _____ 1. If you anticipate a lapse of more than one calendar year before completing requirements for M.Ed. or M.A. program, make a tentative program of study and secure the approval of your major professor.
- _____ 2. If transfer credits (maximum of 9 semester hours) are to be included in your program of study, have the courses approved (approval of Transfer Credit Forms). All requests for transfer credit with accompanying official transcript must be in the Graduate School office at least 30 days prior to the time the student plans to graduate. All courses must have been taken within 6 years and must carry a grad of "B" or above.
- _____ 3. Recommend an Advisory Committee for M.A. degree students, on the proper form, to Dean of the Graduate School. This committee consists of the major professor and two additional staff members. The two additional members of the preliminary examining committee may be recommended at the same time.
- _____ 4. File an approved program of study no later than upon the completion of 5 or 6 courses. This form for MED students is also the FORMAL APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO CANDIDACY, M.A. students will need to submit an additional form for ADMISSION TO CANDIDACY. To be eligible for graduation, a student must maintain a 3.0 (B) average on all graduate courses taken, and on all courses on the program of study.
- _____ 5. Plan (and secure preliminary approval of) a proposed research project unless Plan B is to be used.
- _____ 6. File application for graduation. Deadline for applying to graduate is the beginning of the anticipated graduation date. Deadlines can be found at www.gradsch.uga.edu (Application forms may be submitted at <http://www.gradsch.uga.edu:5080/forms/newgradms.htm>)
- _____ 7. Check with the Graduate School Office concerning all incidental prerequisites to graduation.
- _____ 8. Complete course work and other requirements advised by the major professor. Changes in program must be approved by the major professor, Graduate Coordinator, and the Dean of the Graduate School. Change of Program Forms may be obtained at www.gradsch.uga.edu.
- _____ 9. FOR M.A. DEGREE STUDENTS ONLY:
 - _____ a. Get thesis typing instruments from Graduate Studies at www.gradsch.uga.edu
 - _____ b. Copy of thesis dissertation submitted to Major Professor.
 - _____ c. Submit the original thesis for first format check to the Graduate School.
 - _____ d. Make corrections required by the Graduate School.
 - _____ e. Submit the original of the thesis that has been approved by the Major Professor to the Graduate School for approval.
 - _____ f. Submit the original plus at least three (3) copies of the corrected thesis at least two (2) weeks before graduation.
