The University of Georgia Program in Communication Sciences and Disorders is seeking a speech-language pathology supervisor/clinical educator in the Speech and Hearing Clinic beginning August 1, 2009. Primary responsibilities include supervision and clinical education of graduate students in clinical practicum, teaching clinical seminars, provision of direct clinical services, and service activities.

Position: Regular, full time, 32 – 40 hours per week (requires at least 4 days minimum); 12-months, non-tenure track position

Qualifications:

- Master's or Ph.D. degree required
- Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology required
- Eligibility for Georgia licensure required
- Supervisory experience required, preferably of graduate students
- Excellent oral and written English language skills required
- Expertise in adult neurogenic, dysphagia, and voice disorders required
- Minimum of five years direct clinical service provision preferred

Salary: Dependent on qualifications and experience

Applications: Review of applications will begin May 18, 2009 and will continue until the position is filled. Letter of application, resume, or vitae, and the names/contact information of three references are required of all applicants. Official graduate transcripts, letters of reference, and writing samples will be required only from finalists.
