The University of Georgia invites applications for an assistant level tenure-track position in the Program in Adult Education, a globally-recognized, graduate-level program. This is a 9 month, full time position with opportunities for employment in the summer. Currently, the program includes a variety of degrees: a Ph.D., Ed.D, and M.Ed. in Adult Education as well as a M.Ed. in Human Resource and Organizational Development. This position is officed in Athens and entails teaching online and on the Athens and Gwinnett campuses of UGA starting on August 17, 2010. Qualifications: Required qualifications include an earned doctorate (by July 2010) in Adult Education, or a closely related area; expertise and ability to teach in adult education; ability to conduct scholarly research and publish in refereed journals; ability (or strong potential) to obtain external grants; ability to advise graduate students and direct doctoral progress and dissertations; ability to establish and maintain effective partnerships with agencies internal and external to the university to facilitate research and service; commitment to social justice and diversity; and excellent communication and interpersonal skills.

Desirable qualifications include research expertise, a record of scholarly publications and presentations at scholarly conferences, and research interests and experience in adult learning and development; expertise in quantitative and/or qualitative research; successful teaching experience at the college or university level; and interest in meaningful involvement in leading the future direction of the adult education field.

Responsibilities: Successful candidates will be expected to engage in scholarly research and publication related to adult education, teach in graduate-level programs, advise students, direct dissertations, and serve on graduate student committees, seek external grants, and provide service to the university, state, and profession.
