

# Graduate Assistantship

The graduate faculty in the Department of Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology at the University of Georgia is seeking to increase the representation of under-represented groups in graduate programs in the College of Education. There are particular groups in our state and in our country which are not represented in the same proportion as they are in the rest of the population. We would like to announce an annual competition for a graduate assistantship to be awarded to a qualified graduate student from an under-represented population to study in the Research, Evaluation, Measurement and Statistics (REMS) graduate program. The student also must be a U.S. citizen and must meet the requirements for admission to The University of Georgia Graduate School. One such assistantship will be awarded annually. The assistantship provides a half-time stipend for 12 months, includes a tuition waiver, and will be awarded to the student for a maximum of five years providing satisfactory progress is made to the doctorate. The student receiving this assistantship is expected to work half-time with a research advisor in the REMS program on a project of mutual interest.
