

Assistant or Associate Professor: University of Georgia.

The Special Education program at The University of Georgia invites applicants with a documented research program and potential to secure extra-mural funding in the area of autism spectrum disorders (ASD) to apply for a tenure track assistant/associate professor to start in Fall 2012.

Qualifications include a doctorate (Ph.D., Ed.D.) in special education or related field (e.g., school psychology, communication science and disorders, child development), demonstrated potential for scholarly productivity and experience in university teaching and supervision. Preferred qualifications include Board Certification in Applied Behavior Analysis (BCBA). To be considered for the position of Associate Professor, applicants will have needed to demonstrate four or more years of experience in a position similar to that of an Assistant Professor and document a commensurate publication and teaching record.

Responsibilities include conducting a program of research, teaching at the undergraduate and graduate level in the areas of ASD and applied behavior analysis, obtaining external funding, mentoring and advising students, and participating in service-related activities.
