Course Title: Basis Clinical Procedures in Communication Sciences and Disorders  
Prerequisites: Completion of CMSD 4520 and/or completion or concurrent enrollment in CMSD 4530

Course Overview: The goals of this course are to introduce the basic components of clinical and professional practice and procedures; write behavioral therapeutic objectives and reports; and consider the impact of these components on the practice of speech-language pathology.

4. Demonstrate ability to compute a person’s chronological age and appreciate the necessity of using chronological age when using standardized testing instruments.
5. Demonstrate UGA Speech and Hearing Clinic’s policy on protecting confidentiality of client information through appropriate use of Release and Request forms.
