Introduction	The bulk of this course will be offered through the WebCt environment. Extensive PowerPoint slides will be available for every chapter included. Assignments will include problems at the end of chapters as well as web-based assignments available both in the textbook and on the Houghton Mifflin website.
Additional information	All four quizzes will be taken via WebCt. Each quiz will be available for a specific period of time, typically 48 hours. Once you log on to take the quiz, you will be allowed a specific number of minutes in which to complete the quiz. In most cases you will need a calculator. These are NOT open-book tests. Once every student has completed the quiz, they will be graded and then all scores will be available to students.
