Catalogue Course Description:

The course is designed to acquaint the school leader with federal and state laws which impact on the personnel function of schools.

Course Objective:

Students should develop a critical understanding of the legal underpinning of human resource activities in school systems. At the conclusion of this course the students is expected to know the legal parameters surrounding personnel decisions made by school officials. This includes being familiar with the major requirements of both federal and state law and the interpretations of those legal requirements made by the EEOC, the courts, and other agencies.
