

# PEDB 1080 Beginning Bowling

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**Purpose:** To gain a basic understanding and knowledge of bowling that will enable you to participate in class and successfully play in a recreational setting.

**Requirements:** No text is required for this class. All students will be charged a \$60 fee which will cover shoes and all games played during the semester. This fee must be paid to Showtime Bowling before a student can bowl and participate.

## Course Objectives:

- 1 - Learn the basic fundamentals and skills of bowling.
- 2 - Learn the rules for scoring a game and playing a game of bowling.
- 3 - Inspire students to bowl outside of class and *always have fun*.

**Dress:** Comfortable, non-restrictive appropriate attire should be worn to class. Socks must be worn at all times while bowling. Skirts and blue jeans are discouraged due to the restrictive nature of these types of apparel.

**Attendance:** Regular attendance and class participation are important parts of your final grade. You are allowed **THREE** unexcused absences during the course of semester. If you are late for class three times it will count as an absence. Students are given an extra five minutes to get to class after the normal starting time before roll is collected. **After the roll is collected you are late.** More than **THREE** absences will result in an unsatisfactory grade. Exceptions to these policies (due to extremely unusual circumstance) can be made by talking with me in advance. Sickness, illness, injury or emergencies will be handled on an individual basis and these absences may be excused. *I will have an attendance log for each student to sign. If the log is not signed by the student with the last 4 digits of their social, then they are considered absent. Any student caught falsifying a signature will automatically receive a (U) for the course.*

**Grades:** You will earn either a satisfactory grade (S) or an unsatisfactory grade (U) based on your attendance and a Final exam administered at the end of the semester. The exam will cover basic bowling terminology, rules and scoring. You must get a 60% or higher on this test to pass the class. Students must meet the attendance requirements and score over 60% on the final exam to receive a (S) in the class.
