

## **PEDB 1080 Beginning Bowling Spring Semester 2006: Showtime Bowl**

**Purpose:** To gain a basic understanding and knowledge of bowling that will enable you to participate in class and successfully play in a recreational setting.

**Requirements:** No text is required for this class. All students will be charged a \$60 fee which will cover shoes and all games played during the semester. **This fee must be paid to Showtime Bowling before a student can bowl and participate.**

### **Course Objectives:**

- 1 - Learn the basic fundamentals and skills of bowling.
- 2 - Learn the rules for scoring a game and playing a game of bowling.
- 3 - Inspire students to bowl outside of class and *always have fun*.

**Dress:** Comfortable, non-restrictive appropriate attire should be worn to class. Socks must be worn at all times while bowling. Skirts and blue jeans are discouraged due to the restrictive nature of these types of apparel.

### **Attendance/Participation**

Regular attendance and participation are required. Three absences are permitted during the semester. Missing four or more classes during the semester will result in a grade of Unsatisfactory. Three tardies in this class will be equal to one absence, so do your best to get here on time. If attendance requirements are not met due to injury, sickness, or extremely unusual circumstances, the student may request a medical withdrawal from the Dean of Student Affairs. If attendance requirements are not met for any other reason, the student may withdraw during the withdrawal period or an Unsatisfactory grade will be assigned. **TUESDAY MARCH 7 IS THE LAST DAY TO WITHDRAW.**

### **Grades**

Your grade will be determined from a combination of attendance, participation, and a written final that will be given at the end of the semester. All students must pass the written final with a score of at least 60% to pass the class. There will also be a minor assignment to complete during class.

Attendance/Participation = 10 points

Assignment = 5 points

Written Final = 10 points (must have 6 points to pass the class)

TOTAL = 25 points (must have 15 points to pass the class)

**Assignment:** You will bowl for three class periods and record your own score without the computer. I ask that you check your work and turn in your final score sheet to me when you are finished. These will be checked for accuracy and everyone should turn in a sheet individually.
