The overall purpose of this course is to teach the student the fundamental conceptual knowledge, motor skills, and technique necessary to participate in racquetball at a recreational level.

## **Dress**

Students must wear athletic to participate in class. Street clothes (jeans, sandals, hiking boots, etc.) are not appropriate. Students arriving to class without the proper attire or safety glasses will not be allowed to participate in class and will be credited with an absence.

## **Equipment**

Racquets will be provided.

Each student must purchase a new can of racquetballs and turn them in to the instructor by the third week of class.

Each student will also be responsible for providing their own safety glasses.

These are required for any student to enter the court and should be worn at all times.



## **ACADEMIC HONESTY**
