Introduction to Social Justice and Advocacy in P-16 Settings: The University of Georgia

Dr. Singh developed this course for the Counseling and Student Personnel Services doctoral program to provide students with a foundation in theory, research, and practice of effective leadership on social justice and advocacy issues in P-16 school and university settings.
