Areas in Which Research is Conducted

Feminist research on leisure and gender; leisure theory; sociology of leisure; research methodology including qualitative research methods

My background is in the sociology of leisure with expertise in research methodology. My earliest work focused on outdoor recreation and environmental attitudes; publications from that period are still cited in the literature. I also established an early reputation in research methodology and have published several articles and an invited book chapter on methodological issues in leisure research.

During my doctoral work I moved from an interest in outdoor recreation to an interest in everyday leisure contexts. My dissertation used symbolic interaction as a premise for understanding leisure, and was an important component of theoretical work on leisure and self-expression during the 1990s. More recently I have been influenced by new paradigms including feminist theory, critical theory, post-structuralism, and qualitative epistemology. These frameworks keep me actively engaged in an evolving scholarship and support my growing critique of traditional leisure theory. As a part of this effort, I've deconstructed my own early work to illustrate how *a priori* assumptions shape the nature of research and its results.

Throughout my career my goal has been to promote a greater understanding of women and other marginalized populations for whom leisure is often problematic. As I do this, I am challenging beliefs that leisure is uniformly beneficial and demonstrating how leisure is a context for power and social control as well as a context for resistance and social change.

Impact of Research:

My research has been cited in 351 articles from almost 50 different disciplinary research journals (as recorded in Web of Science, January 2008). I had been cited 61 times by 1994, 166 times by 1998, 209 times by 2001, and 317 times by 2005, documenting the continuing influence of my work in peer-reviewed research journals. One key theoretical article (Samdahl, 1988) has been cited 62 times and is still referenced in contemporary publications. Some of the journals in which my work has been cited include Annual Review of Psychology, Journal of Social Psychology, Journal of Counseling Psychology, Social Science Quarterly, Youth and Society, Australian New Zealand Journal of Sociology, Environment and Behavior, Journal of Environmental Psychology, Social Indicators Research, International Journal of Public Opinion Research, as well as the core leisure journals including Journal of Leisure Research, Leisure Sciences, and Society and Leisure. Because many of the applied leisure research journals are not indexed in the Web of Science, citations from articles in those journals are not included in the above counts.

Instruction

My instructional appointment has been 75%. From 2002-2004 I taught four 3-hour courses per year plus undertook administrative duties without course release for coordinating the Graduate Program. From 2004-2006 I received one course release for being the graduate program coordinator.
