### **PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE**

**2007 – Present: Reappointment as Lecturer and Coordinator of Student Teaching**, *University of Georgia, Department of Kinesiology*. Submitted Dossier and received approval for retention as Lecturer. Submitted and received approval for appointment as Senior Lecturer, from the ad hoc career track Faculty Promotion Committee, effective January, 2009.

**2001 - Present: Lecturer and Coordinator of Student Teaching**, *University of Georgia, Department of Kinesiology*. Responsibilities include working with teachers in the public schools in order to place our students and with the Educational Field Experiences office in the College of Education. During the Spring Semester of 2007 I supervised 21 student teachers in public schools in surrounding counties and corresponding with one student in the COST (Consortium for Overseas Student Teaching) Of the 236 student teachers over the past nine years, I have supervised 186.

Each student spends 9 weeks in an elementary school and 9 weeks in a secondary school. During this time I visit each student a minimum of 5 times, observing them teach. In addition each student must turn in weekly written reports and 5 unit and lesson plans over the semester. Each student is required to email the answers to specific questions regarding their activities for each week. Student teachers have my home and cell phone number and I am available to them 24/7.

During the fall semester of 2003 I taught Foundations of Physical Education where students were

introduced to the heritage, current problems, and future potential of the field they are entering. During the fall semesters of 2004-2006 I taught the Community Service Learning Practicum, the Multicultural Service Learning Practicum classes. In these courses students volunteer with a community or a multicultural organization which integrates community learning experiences into the student's academic curriculum. Students also come away with an understanding of the importance of collaboration among schools and communities. During the fall semester I also taught the Secondary Methods in Physical Education course during which our students experience first hand all the dynamics of secondary school education. This past fall (2006) I added 6 basic program physical education classes to my teaching load.
